## **A2: Direct & Indirect Sinus Grafting – COURSE INFO**

### *Advanced Course Details*

**Course Title:** Direct & Indirect Sinus Grafting

**Course Category:** Advanced Oral Implantology Program

**Overview:** One of the fundamental principles in oral rehabilitation is the fact that the posterior dentition plays a vital role in support and protection of the anterior teeth. As a result, satisfactory and predictable procedures to maintain or re-establish posterior dental support is absolutely essential to the long-term health and stability of the dental system specifically and the stomatognathic system in general. With the loss of maxillary posterior teeth, the pneumatization of the maxillary sinus into the alveolar process will completely eliminates the available bone to support dental implants.

This course describes the options available to the surgical clinician in managing all aspects of vertical bone grafting in the maxillary sinus for the purpose of placing dental implants in or around the area of that sinus. These include vertically placed implants for the localized rehabilitation for the maxillary posterior teeth as well as management of the maxillary sinus for “tilted” posterior implants and “zygomatic” implants. Emphasis will be given to the diagnosis of antral pathology and the procedures required to both minimize and manage complications of these graft surgeries.

One-on-one hands-on surgical instruction is available to those doctors wishing to bring patients to this course. Auditing doctors will be able to observe these surgeries and be able to participate as surgical assistants from time to time. A demonstration surgery will be viewable by all participants during this course.

**Objectives:** Course objectives are for all participants to become knowledgeable in the following:

- To understand the surgical requirements and receive hands-on clinical instruction for:
  - Various techniques for indirect sinus grafting
  - Advanced principles of bone grafting surgery
  - Clinical procedures for direct sinus elevation graft surgery
- The role the posterior dentition plays in supporting of the anterior teeth
- How to establish and maintain posterior dental support
- Repercussions of losing maxillary posterior teeth and its impact on the bone



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- Management of the maxillary sinus for “tilted” posterior and “zygomatic” implants
- How to minimize and manage complication in sinus graft surgeries

**Prerequisites:**

The target of this class are dentists who have basic oral implantology skills already. This class assumes that you have already taken CORE 1, 2 & 3 and recommends having taken ADVANCED 1 or equivalent implant training programs.
