Overview: The restorative aspects in oral Implantology is the both the functional and visible aspect of the treatment plan which determines the functional and esthetic quality of the end result. To many of our patients, the esthetic result is one of the primary keys of success. The very best of these services harnesses the surgical potential with the needs for obtaining optimal implant positioning for the best prosthetic solution. Everything starts with the end in mind.

This course describes the options available to the prosthetic clinician in managing the presurgical treatment plan, guiding surgeons to obtain optimal surgical solutions for the prosthetic phase, and the options available to the prosthetic clinician to manage different solutions for patients with different goals in mind. Computer assisted treatment planning with Nobel Clinician and the use of precision guided templates for the surgeon will be thoroughly discussed.

Specific attention will be placed on transitional restorations and prosthetic options to provide the surgeon with the best opportunity to obtain the most precisely placed implants to yield the optimal prosthetic solution.

Recent advances in abutment design, especially for cemented restorations, will be thoroughly discussed and how to coordinate you needs with the laboratories most proficient in delivering the quality of service you will need for the best results.

Material selection for both strength and esthetics will be discussed in detail allowing you to provide the best options to suit both the high esthetic demanding patient and those patients with high parafunctional habits.

We will provide you with the guidelines for when and where to immediately restore an implant, and definitely when not to immediately restore and implant. Transitional and final full edentulous restorations will be thoroughly discussed.

Objectives:

- Prosthetic solution options for the single tooth restoration.
- How and when to provide immediate provisional restorations.
- Pros and cons of cement retained and screw retained restorations.
- The most recent concepts to avoid cement retention around implants,
- Principles related to Altered Screw Channel restorations which optimize the esthetic potential for anterior implants.
- How to treatment plan for prostheses supported by multiple implants using 3-Dimensional imaging and treatment planning software like Nobel Clinician.
- Fundamental principles of occlusion for crown and bridge restorations and for full arch fixed hybrid prostheses.
- Various restorative material options for restoring fixed hybrid prostheses and their respective designs.

Prerequisites:

The target of this class are dentists who have basic oral implantology skills already. This class assumes that you have already taken CORE 1, 2 and 3 or equivalent implant training programs.
